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In conclusion, analyticity is not the cause of the syntactic change occurring in the development from Latin to Romance, but rather a surface effect of deeper changes (such as the emergence of full configurationality and related functional structure, or a change in the head-branching parameter).

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In contrast to Chapters 3 and 4, which considered an approach to the changes in word order and sentence structure from Latin to Romance in terms of the progressive rise of configurationality and concomitant functional structure, this chapter attempts to demonstrate how the same empirical generalizations can be captured within an approach that assumes the presence of both configurational and ...

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
